WHO ARE OUR CYCLISTS?

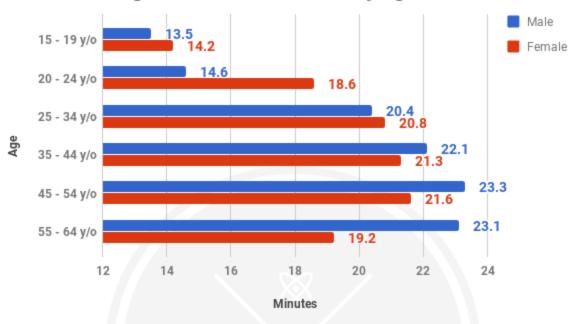

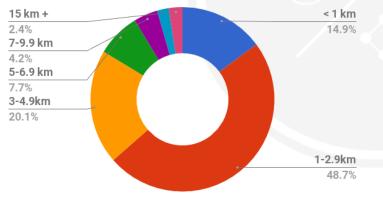

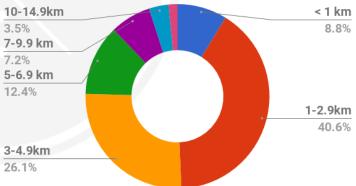


Average Duration of Commute by Age and Sex
