- Distributing and/or posting our content online (for example, on social media or a blog).

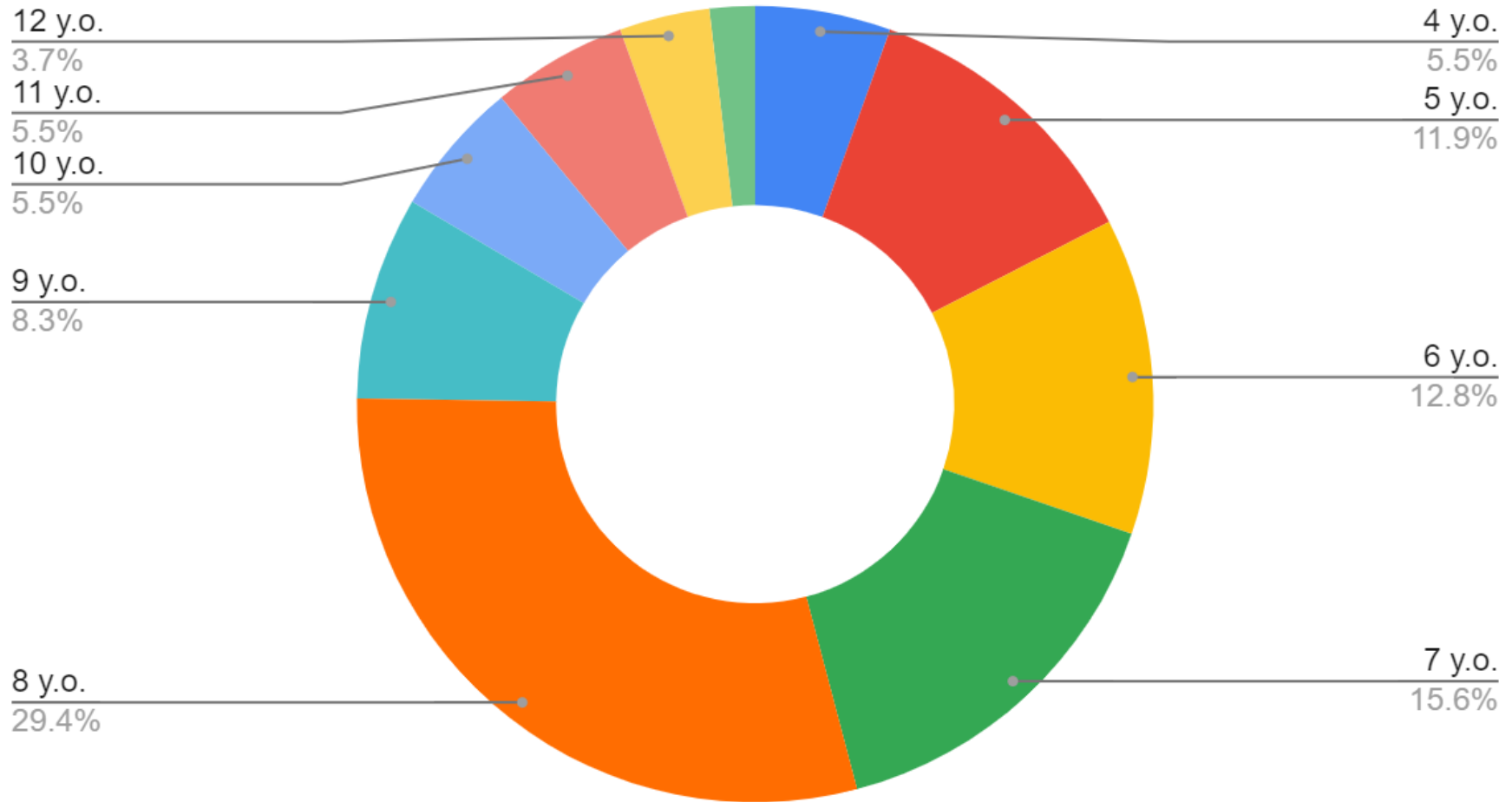

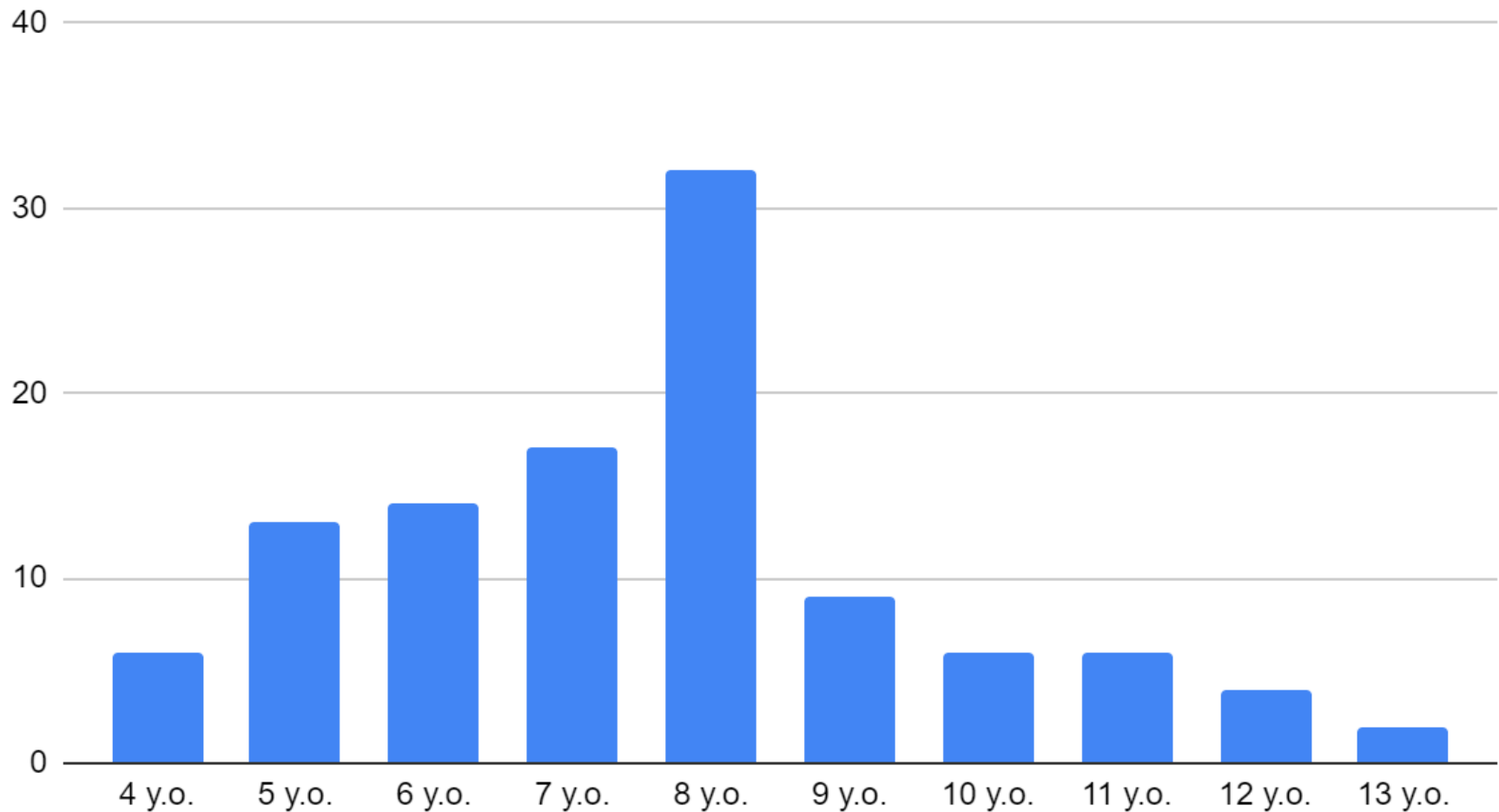

Sample CER Statement

Claim - Most students stop believing in Santa by 8 years of age.

Evidence - According to survey data, 29% of students who were surveyed said that they stopped believing in Santa when they were 8, while 75% of students said that they had stopped believing in Santa at age 8 or before.
